Exterior Holiday Decorating Guidelines

1. Holiday décor can be hung the Friday after Thanksgiving and must be removed by New Years Day.
2. Wreaths allowed under wall lights, but not attached to light fixture.
3. No decorations are to be hung from wall lights.
4. No decorations or plants allowed on stairways handrails, walkways, shrubs, lawns or carports.
5. Garland is allowed on lampposts only.
6. No electrical lights allowed anywhere.
7. Red and Green light bulbs may replace the outside wall light only during the holiday season.
